

Text 1

DESTINED TO FAIL - THE 3D MOVIE TREND

[1] 3D technology is coming on with leaps and bounds, and filmgoers are captivated by its ability to make them feel part of the action. Movies in 3D are becoming such big moneymakers that Hollywood studios are cramming them into the nation's theaters, even though there aren't enough screens available to give each film its fullest possible run. That will mean an unprecedented number of 3D movies for film fans to choose from this spring, and smaller profits for Hollywood studios than they might otherwise get with fewer 3D competitors.

[2] This past weekend I ventured out to see the new 3D movie *How to Train Your Dragon* with two younger siblings in tow. As the adult, the burden of ticket purchasing fell on my shoulders. I was planning on shelling out a decent sum of money to purchase the tickets, but the total was about twice as much as I expected. When I asked the "cheery" teenage cashier behind the glass window why the movie was so much, he replied that it was because we were seeing a "3D" movie.

[3] After the purchase of popcorn and drinks, must haves for any movie experience with small children, my grand total came to about \$50 (yes that is in American currency). What was most astounding was that the tickets cost considerably more than the typically overpriced snacks in theaters.

[4] This change is not unique to my situation at that theater. In an effort to attract larger audiences to the movies, studios have begun to film movies in 3D. While this has generated relatively positive response, the economic burden of producing a 3D film has doomed this growing trend to failure.

[5] The economics behind this can be broken down into three branches: the cost on the studio, the theater and on the audience member. Let's start with the studio. There are two simple ways to create a 3D movie. You can plan on filming the movie in 3D (like James Cameron's Avatar) or you can transfer the film to 3D in post production (like Michael Bay's Transformers 3).

25 [6] When filming a movie as 3D, special cameras need to be used to create an image that is of high enough quality, or the 3D experience is wasted. These cameras are not as abundant as the Hollywood standard and consequently cost a hefty amount to use. The other route, a bit easier to film but equally expensive, is to turn a movie into 3D format during post production. The downside to this path is that the regular cameras used to film a movie don't film in as high a quality, so the transfer of formats costs about \$100,000 to \$150,000 a minute. Nitty-gritty, the cost of making a 3D movie is considerably higher than for making a 2D movie.

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[7] The costs don't stop there. To properly screen a 3D film a theater must purchase the proper camera equipment. Like the 3D cameras, 3D projectors cost a hefty amount which leads to most theaters only having one or two screens with 3D showings. Currently there are only an estimated 3,500 3D screens in the United States, with more being added each month. As a result, fewer 3D movies can be shown during a given movie schedule, which means films have to compete more to earn those slots.
